Leza launched her singing career at age 3 with an impromptu rendition of DoReMi in the Waitomo Caves. The crowd cheered - she was hooked! In the early 90's her enthusiasm was rewarded with a prolific career as a studio session singer, adding her vocals to countless tracks by NZ artists including Moana, Dave Parker, 3 the Hard Way, Kantuta, Greg Johnson and Jan Hellreigel to name a few.

She joined forces with Mark Tierney and Paul Casserly as part of their jingle machine, singing on countless edgy ditties for tv and radio play. Through this Leza became a collaborator in Mark and Paul's project, Strawpeople. Her vocals on the haunting APRA Silver Scroll winning "Sweet Disorder" won her the ear of the industry and a place in the CD collections of thousands of kiwis.

The door opened to a career gigging live with her band UNION and numerous TV spots, three Christmas's in the Park, two Starlight Symphonies and shows with the country's top artists like Debbie Harwood, Eddie Raynor, Tina Cross, Jackie Clarke, Mark Williams and Graham Brazier. A definite highlight was working with the immortal Renee Geyer and the APO at the Aotea centre - what a joy!

More recently, Leza continues to wow crowds with the inimitable music and energy that is UNION, and has been busy adding more strings to her musical bow as a DJ to the stars and singing a little sultry jazz around town.
